

BSA Fieldbook Wins Award: A Perfect Holiday Gift

The nonprofit National Outdoor Book Awards Foundation just announced that the Fieldbook: Scouting's Manual of Basic and Advanced Skills for Outdoor Adventure, has won its Work of Significance Award. The Fieldbook is only the third book to win this rare honor.



What is the Fieldbook? In short, it's a compendium of outdoor knowledge oriented to young people. A short list of topics include planning trips, preparing menus, outdoor cooking, backcountry hygiene, navigation, leave no trace camping, first aid, survival, and observing and caring for the natural world. It also covers techniques of specific sports including backpacking, mountain travel, ski touring, snowshoeing, canoeing, kayaking, rafting and caving.

Camping Awards

Troop 59 has its own **Honor Camping Award** to recognize and award Scouts who achieve significant milestones in camping. The primary purpose of this award is to provide

incentive to Scouts to be active participants on our camping outings and to honor the most dedicated campers in the Troop – will that be you?

There are four tiers and corresponding belts awarded: 40 nights (grey); 80 nights (brown); 120 nights (red) and 150 nights (black). After reaching each milestone, the Scout is awarded the appropriate Honor Camper webbed belt.

National Outdoor Award

The BSA offers the National Outdoor Award Badges for Camping, Hiking, Aquatics, Riding, and Adventure To earn the National Outdoor Award for Camping, scouts must:

Camping: 1). Earn the First Class rank. 2). Earn the Camping merit badge. 3). Earn two of the following three merit badges: Cooking, First Aid, Pioneering. 4). Complete 25 days and nights of camping—including six >>

consecutive days (five nights) of resident camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America—including nights camped as part of requirements 1 through 3 above.

A gold device may be earned for each additional 25 nights of camping. A silver device is earned for each additional 100 nights of camping. The Scout may wear any combination of devices totaling his current number of nights camping.

The National Outdoor Award also includes badges for Hiking, Aquatics, Riding and Adventure. You can learn more about those requirements at http://www.scouting.org/scoutsource/BoyScouts/Youth/Awards/NOA.aspx
